The Sullivan University College of Pharmacy first opened its doors to 74 students in July 2008, who will be the inaugural graduating class of 2011. Sullivan University COP offers an accelerated program, allowing students to earn their Doctor of Pharmacy degree in three years (after 2 years of pre-requisite courses) rather than the typical four professional years. Sullivan University COP is accredited by ACPE at the Candidate level; full accreditation status will be considered by ACPE following graduation of the first class.

The University of Kentucky College of Pharmacy is located in Lexington, Kentucky. UK Pharmacy students are #1 in the nation in first-time pass rates on the national licensing exam, and is ranked #5 in the U.S. News and World Report's survey of pharmacy programs. The University of Kentucky COP is currently completing a new facility that will open this year (2010) and will be the largest pharmacy education building in the world. UK Pharmacy students represent 98 counties in the state of Kentucky. University of Kentucky COP is accredited by ACPE.

The University of Cincinnati College of Pharmacy is one of the oldest Colleges of Pharmacy in the United States, and was the first College of Pharmacy west of the Alleghenies. In 2007 the University of Cincinnati COP changed its name to James L. Winkle College of Pharmacy. University of Cincinnati COP offers Pharm.D., M.S., and Ph.D. degrees. Graduates of the college have a 100% placement rate prior to graduation and are highly sought after by professional and pharmaceutical employers. University of Cincinnati COP is accredited by ACPE.

Butler University College of Pharmacy & Health Sciences originated in 1904, and was recently ranked by the US News and World Report as one of the top pharmacy colleges in the United States. Butler University COP offers a liberal arts education, which prepares students for lifelong learning. Butler University COP has the third highest board rates in the country and is the #1 private institution with a 99.26% pass rate. Butler University COPHS is accredited by ACPE.
